Steam

The title of the play in Slovak, 'Para', is a play on the Slovak word for steam, 'para', and the Greek prefix, 'para' which is used to indicate strange, perverse, or abnormal phenomena. Five characters – the indistinct HATTY, the fearful BABS, the controlling CHARLIE, the beloved DERMOT and the over-looked but at the same time dangerous DICK – change names according to the situations in which they find themselves. The action takes place in a spa complex which the characters visit in order to hide from their partners, but, above all, in order to hide from themselves. In this artificial world of steam and echoes, staff and customers come together, as well as landlords and tenants, the naked and the clothed, spouses and lovers, those who abandon and those who love. Cleansing steam-baths, spa-treatments, massages and conversations are replaced by banal, random violence. No-one is safe. Maybe these chance witnesses of their own lives will find out what has happened from the evening news. And that's why you should never ask for whom the mobile tolls.... It might be yours. - 2003 -

BABS	A right Charlie.	
HATTY	Don't you worry about Dick. He'll be fine in a moment.	
BABS	He swans about in those clogs as if the whole place belongs to	
	him.	
HATTY	Well it probably does.	
BABS	You seem to know your way about here.	
HATTY	I'm part of the furniture.	
BABS	And don't Dicks like that get on your nerves?	
HATTY	Where-ever you go, they're Dicks there.	
BABS	To think that I pay him for the privilege!	
HATTY	He doesn't make his money from this sauna, don't you worry.	
BABS	The worst ones are the ones who wander about in shorts and you	
	can see their hairy calves.	
HATTY	You can tell everything about a man from his legs.

BABS	That must be convenient.	
HATTY	Average height, average looks, average brain.	
BABS	Do you wish you were on the beach?	
HATTY	Why?	
BABS	Or is it the light in here?	
HATTY	People are always wearing some sort of glasses, even if they don't	
	realize it And the darker they are, the safer it is.	
Sound	Clogs.	
DICK	There you go, Boob, towel, robe, and when you're finished, chuck	
	it all in that basket. Today, babes, we'll be closing a little bit	
	early. So don't get too comfortable Will you be wanting a	
	massage?	
BABS	What, from you?	
HATTY	Go on; the first ten minutes are included in the price.	
BABS	Well I'm not sure.	
DICK	Well just let me know when OK?	

THE CHANGING ROOM

DERMOT	(answer machine) If you must leave me a message, then go ahead.	
BABS	(under her breath) Hi. Where are you? Oh, don't worry. Right	
	now I'm in the Relax Centre, or Chill Out Centre, or something	
	idiotic like that. It probably doesn't matter OK, see you.	
SOUND	After a pause, a short beep. A mobile phone dialling. Ringing.	
	The same voice on the answer machine.	
BABS	Yes!	
DERMOT	(answer machine) If you must leave me a message, then go ahead.	
BABS	Shit!	

THE SAUNA

DADO		
BABS	Uff	
HATTY	Just like being in a sauna, hey?	
BABS	Yes It's great that there's nobody else here today.	
HATTY	What normal person would be here today?	
BABS	Aren't you normal?	
HATTY	No, I'm having therapy here: anti-shock therapy.	
BABS	What sort of shock?	
HATTY	Just regular shock, life-shock. Time for a change – that's what an	
	optimist would say. But I'm such a boob that I probably shan't be	
	leaving.	
BABS	Where would you be going?	
HATTY	For the moment I'm only certain about where I'm coming from	
BABS	Do think we could hear a mobile ringing in here?	
HATTY	Definitely not.

CHARLIE	I bet you didn't let your Mummy feed you. "Me, me. I'll do it?"

BABS	You're wife or whoever doesn't she fall over enough for	
	you?	
CHARLIE	My wife has fallen off her trolley once and for all. She skipped

- SOUND approaching footsteps in sandals.
- BABS You're a right Charlie.
- DICK What are you doing here?
- CHARLIE I'm waiting for my wife.
- DICK Wait somewhere else then. Are you ready, Babsy? Can we go massage?
- BABS Fine... Let's get it over with...
- CHARLIE Tell her that I'm waiting in the bar.

HATTY Why are you looking at me like that?
DERMOT Why do you want make-up on in the sauna?
HATTY A woman of my age without make-up can be quite scary.
DERMOT What Charlie are you making yourself up for?
HATTY How do you know that it's for some Charlie.
DERMOT Because in that respect we're all Charlies... I'm looking for a girl.
HATTY Are you her boyfriend?

DERMOT	Babs's?	
HATTY	She's called Babs?	
DERMOT	That's what I called her	
HATTY	I think she's desperately waiting for you.	
DERMOT	That's just the problem.	
HATTY	Dermot dear, she must be somewhere here; she just left the sauna.

DICK	Turn your head to the side You won't need that here What's
	the matter?

DICK	I know good dough when I see it.
BABS	Ow.
DICK	What's up, Booby? I'm just kneading you a little bit. You tell
	your
BABS	Ooww that neck's mine.
DICK	Don't you worry, I've got a diploma.
BABS	What good's that going to do me when I'm stuck in a wheelchair?
DICK	Not everybody, Babs, has got a diploma like mine.
BABS	Whose neck did you wring to get that?
DICK	Come back here again, and you'll see. Maybe today you'll feel a
	bit bruised, but tomorrow you'll be as fit as a fish.
BABS	dumbly staring at the world, hey?
DICK	Have you got a sense of humour?
BABS	I seem to have lost it all of a sudden.
DICK	I like telling jokes.
BABS	For God's sake. That hurts.
DICK	Are you a blonde?
BABS	No.
DICK	It's not a dye-job, is it?
BABS	Are you going to tell me jokes about blondes?
DICK	But you're not a Jew?
BABS	If I were, would the massage be cheaper or more expensive?
DICK	Or a feminist?
BABS	Ooww.

CHARLIE	Is anyone serving here?
SOUND	Doors opening. Several male voices.
CHARLIE	Ah Excuse me yes
Sound	Doors closing. Soft footsteps.
DERMOT	An orange juice, please.
CHARLIE	I didn't hear you coming.
DERMOT	I'm barefoot. An orange juice, please.
CHARLIE	I don't work here.
DERMOT	Well, who are you?
CHARLIE	A customer just like you, Dearie.
DERMOT	Dearie?

CHARLIE You're someone's Dearie, aren't you? Or is it Dear?

- DERMOT And you are definitely somebody's Charlie. Can't you bring me something to drink?
- CHARLIE I tell you, nobody's serving here. Do I really look like some sort of Dick who serves beer?
- DERMOT Well where are the real Dicks, then?
- CHARLIE I wouldn't you advise to call them here right now.
- DERMOT Are they playing cards or Russian roulette?
- CHARLIE I don't quite get the rules, but they've got big piles of money
- DERMOT As long as it's not my money...
- CHARLIE It looks like they're having a good time... They've got everything charged up, their mobiles, and their... revolvers. Is that four-wheel drive outside yours?
- DERMOT Sadly not...
- CHARLIE Those ones can really fly.
- DERMOT I prefer flying without a car.
- CHARLIE Do you come here often?
- DERMOT Are you having a good time?
- CHARLIE It's just that I haven't seen you here before.
- DERMOT That's because it's the first time I've been here.
- CHARLIE Why is this the first time you've been here?
- DERMOT Because I haven't been here before.
- CHARLIE Why are you here today?
- DERMOT Have you got a problem with me?
- SOUND The beep of a text message.
- CHARLIE Somebody loves you.
- DERMOT That's the way it is sometimes.
- CHARLIE Aren't you going to look to see who?
- DERMOT I know anyway.

- CHARLIE How can you be so sure?
- DERMOT There are only two options.
- CHARLIE She loves me she loves me not?
- DERMOT They both love me.
- CHARLIE Well... in that case we're all jealous of you. Are you waiting for that pretty, young girl. Are you going to dump her, or is she going to dump you?
- DERMOT What's that to do with you?
- CHARLIE I'm interested. So are you leaving your Booby?
- DERMOT Booby?
- CHARLIE Who else can one leave if not Booby.
- DERMOT I called her Babs.
- CHARLIE And you think that you can do that? Leave someone? I've been leaving my wife ever since we got married, and that's fifteen years ago
- DERMOT Is your wife the blonde?
- CHARLIE The rather plain Fatty. At last...
- CHARLIE Hello, you've got customers!
- DICK We're closed.
- CHARLIE Well, if you give me something to drink, you'll be open again
- DICK Don't be such a smart-ass, OK?
- CHARLIE Compared with you we're all geniuses
- DICK You know what? Get lost. You've got no business being here today.

SOUND furniture being scraped...

- DERMOT OK, OK, we've got the point. Calm down, OK? We'll just wait for the women and in a minute we'll be off. OK? It's all alright...
- DICK But the sooner the better, because in a minute we're closing.

SOUND	clogs leaving
CHARLIE	Are you just as good with women and children?
DERMOT	That's the way it is sometimes.
CHARLIE	And what do you do apart from getting everybody to love you?
DERMOT	I distribute teddy bears
CHARLIE	Really? That's good What sort?
DERMOT	Fluffy little teddies.
CHARLIE	And then you're surprised that everybody loves you.
DERMOT	I'm not surprised.
CHARLIE	You're a bigger Charlie than I am Is it well paid?
DERMOT	Being loved?
CHARLIE	The bears.
DERMOT	I don't need wealth
CHARLIE	Of course When you stop enjoying it, you'll move in with a
	woman who has everything.
DERMOT	I'm getting an allergic reaction.
CHARLIE	To me? Why? I'm just asking You said that you go flying?
	How, exactly?
DERMOT	On a parachute.
CHARLIE	Where the wind blows you?
DERMOT	Exactly.
CHARLIE	A paraglider? Or a fly-by-night?
DERMOT	Why are you asking if you know the answers already?
CHARLIE	Do you know what 'para' means?
DERMOT	I know a few paranormal Charlies, why?
CHARLIE	Everything that begins with 'para' is different, perverse,
	abnormal.

DERMOT Are you calling me a pervert?

CHARLIE I'm just interested that 'para' as a prefix can mean beside, with and at the same time against and beyond. Do you know what I mean?

DERMOT I don't get it.

MUSIC

THE RELAXATION ROOM

- BABS Has someone arrived?
- HATTY My husband.
- BABS Aha.
- HATTY I can always hear him, arguing with someone. He's always making a scene like a right Charlie. In every shop and every restaurant. That man is capable of spoiling absolutely everything for me. Before I married him, I was generally a happy young girl...
- BABS I can't just lie here like this.
- HATTY One has to practice being lazy. Look at me... I just lie here and nothing bothers me.

BABS I don't have the time to wait.

- HATTY Where are you hurrying off to? Bad news'll find you just the same.
- BABS Isn't someone's phone ringing?
- HATTY Forget it, Boobs! That's not the way to behave. If somebody wants to pick you up or leave you, let them make the running and do it in person. If you're going to be stupid like that, just switch it off. No news is good news. No virtual blokes, no expectations... No having, no touching, no possessions, no ties ...
- BABS Is that a new religion?

HATTY	A basic philosophy of life. People should go on walks, appreciate
	flowers, and keep to a good diet.
BABS	What sort of diagnosis does that work for?
HATTY	Chronically untreated unhappiness? What do I know
BABS	I'm an acute case.
HATTY	Do you know what I would give not to have anybody? Your
	mobile-telephonist is here already. He's waiting for you in the
	bar. Dermot dear, the darling.
BABS	Why didn't you tell me before?
HATTY	You've got time. Your whole life. Do your hair, put on some
	makeup. At least have a bit of style about it.

THE FOYER

DERMOT	You rang me.
BABS	About a thousand times.
DERMOT	Yes
BABS	You're lucky that you've finally found me. Are you leaving me?
DERMOT	It was great. Really.
BABS	Couldn't you face sleeping with me again? Where do you have to
	go in such a dreadful hurry?
DERMOT	I wanted to do it as soon as possible.
BABS	Before what?
DERMOT	I don't want you to think about it right now
BABS	There isn't anything to think about
DERMOT	Because it doesn't matter.
BABS	Right. And who doesn't it matter to?
DERMOT	It's a complex.
BABS	My complex?

DERMOT	A complex of various things. People aren't made of Lego.
BABS	Have I got a problem?
DERMOT	What can I say without hurting you?
BABS	I didn't expect anything from you just that you existed.
DERMOT	That's just it. You don't give a man a chance.
BABS	What sort of chance did you want? Was I meant to make you a
	baby-father? Or what?
DERMOT	You know that I'm still just a little Dickie. I need people to love
	me
BABS	I loved you!
DERMOT	Wasn't I loving to you?
BABS	Well? So what? Didn't we have what we needed?
DERMOT	Sometimes we want things that don't need.
BABS	Are you dumping me?
DERMOT	Baby
BABS	How can you just fly off like this?
DERMOT	How else should I do it?
BABS	Aren't you just a little bit sorry?
PATO	I can't have everything. After all, what is everything?
BABS	You don't know what everything is?
DERMOT	Everything is relative. It depends how you look at it.
BABS	You Charlie.
DERMOT	Beauty is in the eyes of the beholder.
BABS	I love you.
DERMOT	Love also is in the eyes of the beholder.
BABS	You're a right Dick. Haven't we got enough bears at home?
DERMOT	Why don't I have a right to pleasant relationships. I wanted us to
	split up and be chilled about it.
BABS	Well, we're splitting up in the Chill Out Centre

DERMOT It's called the Relax Centre.

BABS Why does it have to be like this? Were sitting here on this bench like a couple of Charlies...

DERMOT You came here.

- BABS I'm terribly hungry. Can't we go and get something to eat together?
- DERMOT They don't serve food here.

BABS Well let's go somewhere else.

DERMOT Look, I haven't got the time, Baby. I was just waiting for you to come.

BABS Sorry to have kept you!

DERMOT Why are you hurting me?

- BABS I'm hurting you? I'd rather not be talking to you at all... But who else am I meant to say it to? Who else is interested, apart from the two of us!
- DERMOT Baby, Baby! Calm down. Babbly, Booby, Boobsy... Shall I take you home?
- BABS Leave me be.. I have to cool down here a bit. If I go outside now, something'll happen to me.
- DERMOT Are you hot or cold? Come on, I'll take you back, and I'll wrap you up in a blanket. Press yourself against me. Harder. Is that warmer? I'll wrap you all up so that not even your nose shows. Babby, Babblies. How are you? Better? Can you feel me? Is that good? Are you lying down?... I'm just going.

MUSIC

THE STAIRS

DICK Don't kill yourself!

CHARLIE Who are you speaking to like that, you Dick! What sort of Charlie designed this place. DICK You understand these things, do you? Are you an architect? CHARLIE You're not one either. These steps shouldn't be here. DICK You're a smart one! CHARLIE Anybody can see that. DICK You know what? I've told you once. Take your squeaky shoes and wait outside. Do you hear me? **CHARLIE** Fine... No problem, I was just thinking ... DICK Out! CHARLIE ... that it would be better without these steps... DICK Get lost, OK? CHARLIE My wife's there. DICK Wait for her outside. Patty'll be there in a minute. It's cold outside. CHARLIE SOUND approaching steps. HATTY What's going on here? I'd rather you left my husband alive. DICK We're closing in a minute, OK? SOUND clogs leaving. HATTY Do you have to argue with everyone. Are you right in the head? And with a Charlie like that? CHARLIE But that's Dick. HATTY Well he's got a loaded revolver stuck into his belt somewhere. Not everybody in the world is yours to boss about. You should work out how many people you've got on your side, and act accordingly. CHARLIE Is that the way you want to talk? HATTY Can't you just stay at home on your own CHARLIE Patty, is that you?

- HATTY At least somewhere people love me...
- CHARLIE Have I done something again? I'll take you home.
- HATTY You don't have to look after me. I'm not drunk.
- CHARLIE You had your licence taken away.
- HATTY So? What do you think's going to happen? Something terrible? I'll take a cab.
- CHARLIE A taxi right out of the city! You must be feeling rich.
- HATTY I didn't want to live in a field!
- CHARLIE You've never said anything before about where we live.
- HATTY How was I to know how I'd feel there?
- CHARLIE Normal people can guess how they'll react to things.
- HATTY And the whole day I've been talking to certified lunatics.
- CHARLIE You're crazy! All of a sudden you start dragging home all sorts of estate agents! If I hadn't picked up the phone by accident, I wouldn't even know that they've found us a replacement flat. Can you tell me why at least?
- HATTY There's a dog that barks.
- CHARLIE So we're going to complain every time some rabid dog starts barking?
- HATTY That's right. I've got a phobia. A phobia of the field, of the village, of dogs and of you. Phobias have nothing to do with logic.
- CHARLIE It's easy to solve problems, but we're dealing with feelings.
- HATTY Including yours.
- CHARLIE Do we have to solve this right here and now?
- HATTY You came to find me here
- CHARLIE You're never at home...

I was calling you all day. Why do you have a mobile if you never hear it?

- HATTY I can't be available all the time.
- CHARLIE That's right, you're often in a plane, a helicopter... on a parachute. Don't you want to talk to me anymore?
- HATTY I talk to you all the time
- CHARLIE That's news to me
- HATTY I'm in eternal inner dialogue with you
- CHARLIE You're an island all for yourself
- HATTY No. I'm an archipelago
- CHARLIE Can't you be a little more rational?!
- HATTY How can I be rational when I'm arguing?
- CHARLIE You look so rough. You've got cream on your face that you haven't rubbed in properly.
- HATTY Do you always have to tell me what I look like? Why don't you just go away for once?
- CHARLIE I'll wait for you in the car.
